AGENDA ITEM	Notes
1. Welcome & Call to Order & Establish Quorum	Following the establishment of a quorum, the meeting was called to order by Chairperson, T. DelNero.
2. Approval of 10-9-19 Minutes	<i>C. McNerney made a motion, N. Hill seconded the motion, and council members unanimously passed to approve the October 9, 2019 Minutes as presented.</i>
3. 1st Semester Suspension Data	The District Disposition Summary was distributed for review of suspensions from the First Semester. The data shared was based on enrollment and dispositions during school years 2017/2018, 2018/2019, 2019/2020. While the data shows the percentage of suspensions has increased this year from last year, the increase in enrollment should be considered when reviewing the data. There has been an increase in enrollment and suspensions for Hispanic students and suspensions for African American students has decreased. Foster and Homeless students are counted in their own categories. Students are learning lessons and it is hopeful that the disparities will decrease. It was suggested to address the drug issues and explore Anti-Gang education. D. Craig will bring data on suspensions by grade level to the next meeting.

<p>4. LCAP Survey Feedback</p>	<p>Results from the LCAP Survey completed by students, parents, and staff at each of the EGUSD comprehensive high schools was distributed for review. It was noted that not all questions were either asked or that the same question was asked for all three groups. Members paired up and analyzed the results to see if they aligned with the Action List sharing the following points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students and parents were not in favor of the later start time for the school day. ● Students measured that smaller class sizes were not important. However, it was noted that experiences and perspectives can vary. ● Students did not find it important to have challenging and interesting courses. ● Gaps were found in the survey and specific priorities in the LCAP Action List, i.e, EL support, PBIS, etc.

It was noted that any advisory committee member is required to have access to the complaint procedures. b. A suggestion was made to remind students, parents, and staff about the Catapulting Reporting that is on the school's website. c. Concern was expressed about Advocacy Lessons not being followed by all staff members.
