Evaluation of the 2019-2020 Site LCAP <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Goal 1-Curriculum and Instruction ● Goal 2- Assessment ● Goal 3- Wellness ● Goal 4- Parent and Community Involvement 	Members reviewed and evaluated the 2019-2020 Site LCAP for Goals 1-4. (Prepared document by J. Keyport to be attached.) It was noted that the After-School Library Technician position will be eliminated, with a change made to the hours of the regular school day Library Technician to begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at 4:30 p.m. for offering after-school library services..
4. New Business	Transportation Issues: Parent frustration has increased about the district’s challenges with transporting students who are participating in activities and athletic events. It was shared that the superintendent has addressed the issues at his advisory committee meetings and the district’s efforts to recruit bus drivers. There are currently 160 bus routes with only 120 drivers. On any given day, Transportation supervisors arrive at 5:00 a.m. to

	determine routes that need to be absorbed by available drivers due to shortages of drivers. Job Faires have been offered to recruit drivers and incentives extended in those efforts. This is a country-wide issue, and there will not be any pay raises offered to employees due to the need for hiring additional bus drivers.
